Dear Brothers,

I have accepted in humility the responsibility entrusted to me by Rev. Bro. Dionigi Taffarello, Superior General and the General Council, as Provincial Superior of the Province of Hyderabad for the second term of office (2025-2028). I am grateful to the Superior General and the General Council for their trust in me and deeply acknowledge all the Brothers of the Province for their faith and hope in my leadership.

Let us journey together as Pilgrims of Hope, as Good Samaritans with compassion, kindness, tolerance, acceptance and appreciation of one another during this grace filled Jubilee Year. May Our God and Lord, Our Brother: Jesus Christ, guide and lead us all for the good of the Province. Let all Glory be to God, for Him and through Him.

My Dear Brothers,

I would like to share some reflections on the Gospel passage that inspired me on 31st January 2025, the day of my appointment as Provincial for the second mandate (2025-2028).



Gospel of Mathew 9:9-13

*As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, “**Follow me**”. And he got up and followed him and as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with Jesus and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, “Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?” But when he heard this, he said, “Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, **'I desire mercy, not sacrifice'**. For I have not come to call the righteous but sinners”.*

Reflection 1

It was unusual for a Rabbi or religious person to dine with sinners or the poor. Some religious people found it difficult that Jesus went among the people everyone else thought were sinners. Jesus himself had no difficulty with that. He went to Mathew's house and both enjoyed his host's company and ate with his guests. All he wanted was that the very good religious people, would know their need of his healing and mercy too. He knew that unless they knew their own weakness, they would never know the love of the Father. He gave them a simple example that you don't go to the doctor unless you are sick, nor to any health-care person unless you need help. We are all like that - people in need.

Reflection 2

Jesus desires the merciful heart, a heart like his. Mercy covers over sin and faults; sees beyond what a person does to who a person is. All of us need the mercy of God for sins and faults and failings. We need also the mercy of each other. We can sacrifice people on the table of mockery, sarcasm or backbiting. Prayer can help us be merciful in word and in deed.

Reflection 3

As God helps me to look honestly at my life, I realise how much I am in need of help. I am not disheartened because Jesus reminds me that he is most present to those who know their need.

Reflection 4

People did not expect the tax collectors to be called to be religious disciples. I think of my talents and aptitudes and wonder again how Jesus is calling me to this way of consecrated life.

Reflection 5

As I move through this day, I quietly consider how Jesus wants to call all those around me. If I do not understand why, it is because I do not see what Jesus sees.

My Dear Brothers,

Never has been a time in history when we needed an intervention into our spiritual lives more than we do today. This is the time for a reassessment of our community life, our behaviour, our values and our goals as consecrated persons in the Church and as members of a government recognised charitable society, established for serving the poor through education and empowerment programs and activities.

In the world today, many of us feel that the acute individualism, the unkindness, the inhuman attack has always been this way and that, it is only now, that everyone knows about it and we have full sight of all our actions.

It is time to question the corporate reality we have become so accustomed to and ask if consecrated life is truly fulfilling us as it should be. Are we happy? Do we find joy in our communities and do we find joy in our province?

My dear Brothers, Healing and reconciliation is the most urgent need of the Province of Hyderabad. Community animation, being faithful to prayer life, regularity of community dialogue, upholding religious discipline and religious values are crucial for making our life as consecrated persons relevant in the 21st century.

It's our duty and responsibility to renew ourselves as individuals, as communities and as a province with growing sense of empathy and enriching spiritual life. As we, Montfortians ardently desire to become a prophetic presence in the 21st century, we need to refocus our mission priorities for the poor at the periphery.

I would like to conclude my message with a reading from the Bible, St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians 4: 1-32 for our continuous reflection and renewal as Consecrated Brothers, Religious Communities and as a Province.

Unity and Diversity in Christ.

Therefore, as a prisoner for the Lord, I implore you to behave in a manner worthy of the calling you have received, with all humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another in a spirit of love. Make every possible effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, as well as one hope to which you have been called by your vocation, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and works through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure in which Christ allotted it. Therefore, it is written,

*“When he ascended to the heights,
he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to his people.”*

Now the word “ascended” implies that he also descended into the lower regions of the earth. The one who descended is also the one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things. It was he who established some as apostles, some as prophets, some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers. So he prepared those who belong to him for the ministry, in order to build up the body of Christ, until all of us attain to the unity of faith and the knowledge of the Son of God, thus we shall become the perfect man, reaching maturity with the fullness of Christ. In this way, we will no longer be like children, tossed back and forth by the waves and swept along by every new wind of teaching, emanating from human cunning and craftiness and leading people into error. Rather, professing truth and love, we will in all things grow into him who is the head, Christ. From him, comes the growth of the entire body, to which a network of joints gives order and cohesion, taking into account and making use of the function of each one, so the body, builds itself in love, as each part performs its particular function.

The Newness of the Christian Life.

Therefore, I declare and advise in the Lord that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds. They are darkened in their understanding and alienated from the life of God because of their ignorance and their hardness of heart. As a result of their corruption, they have abandoned themselves to sensuality and have eagerly given themselves to every kind of immorality. That is not how you learned Christ.

Clearly, you were told about him and were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You were taught to cast aside the old self of your former way of life that had been corrupted by its captivating desires. You are to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to clothe yourselves with the new self-created in God's image, in the way of uprightness and holiness that belong to the truth.

A Life Based on Love. Therefore, cease your lying and speak the truth to each other, for we are all members of one another. If you are angry, do not sin. Do not let the sun set on your anger, and do not give the devil an opening. Anyone who has been stealing must no longer do so; rather, let him labor, performing some honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with those in need. Let no foul word ever pass your lips. Say only what is useful for edification, so that your words may benefit your listeners. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God who has marked you with his seal for the day of redemption. Remove all forms of bitterness and wrath and anger and shouting and slander, as well as all malice from your lives. Rather, be kind to one another and compassionate, and forgive one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.

May God strengthen our inner being through His Spirit. May Christ dwell in our hearts through strengthened faith, may we all be rooted in and founded on love of Christ.

Associate Members

There is a deep hunger for God among the people. Association with one another is a way to deepen our spiritual life. Lay people who want to share and deepen the Montfortian spirituality, associate themselves with the Montfortians and thus become associate members.

We realize the gift of the Holy Spirit to expand and embrace new forms in order to communicate God's grace to the People of God in the mission of the Church. Associate members are such gifts of the Holy Spirit given to the religious institutes. The laity who share the Montfortian spirituality are called 'Gabrielite Associate Member'

An Associate is a person who desires to live the Montfortian charism in its spiritual and missionary dimension, who wants to make it known and spread. An Associate may also be a person who co-operates with the Brothers in the mission, and particularly in the realms of education, justice and peace.

Learning from Experiences and Experiment

Many feel that appreciation of the bonding, support and mutual enrichment is possible through the associate relationship. Some others say that importance and potential of prayer and faith sharing have to be emphasized.



Identity of An Associate

Montfortian Gabrielite Associates will be more focused on personal growth in Gospel spirituality according to the spirituality of St Montfort. Montfortian Gabrielite Associates will be focusing on the four means to acquire Wisdom, given by St. Montfort in his "True Devotion to Mary": "The ardent desire to possess Wisdom, the continual prayer, the universal self-denial (the Cross) and the consecration to Jesus through the hands of Mary" (30th G. C. 29).

Associate Members and Mission consists in making Christ present to the world by a personal witnessing. The partaking in a mission involves a permanent communion with the charism of the Founder and the spirit of the institute.

Spirituality of the Associates

The spirituality of associates is a relational spirituality or an associative spirituality. It is based on relationship between equal partners in the mission of the Church. Encourages the new experiences of communion and cooperation between the religious and associates and hope that these can serve the spread of a fruitful spirituality beyond the boundaries of the Congregations.

The Goals of the Association

- To live the Montfortian spirituality;
- To make it known;
- To spread it;
- To co-operate with the Brothers in the mission, and particularly in the realms of education of the poor, justice and peace

Criteria of Belonging to the Association

- To adhere to the Gospel message and live up one's faith;
- To be drawn to the Montfortian spirituality especially by its Marian aspect;
- To be ready to live some events in a group;
- To express a willingness to commit oneself in the mission, at least through prayer in case of restricted availability;
- To adhere to the association through a public commitment either by a charter or better still through the "Consecration to Jesus through Mary" according to St. Louis-Marie de Montfort that importance and potential of prayer and faith sharing have to be emphasized

Who can be a Lay Collaborator in the Mission?

A lay collaborator is one who:

- Obtains membership by a voluntary decision to be part of the project of the Congregation;
- Has a strong will to promote the project put forward by the Province / Institution;
- Has a strong commitment to the mission entrusted to the collaborators;
- Has the willingness to participate in activities organized by the Province / Institutions (formation programs, involvement with the poor, the marginalized..);
- Is gifted with the spirit to work as a team;
- Is ready to commit oneself free of charge, to be selfless;
- Has to be a person of spiritual and moral character (life of integrity).

Networking

Networking is important and necessary to develop Partnership. It will help us to work together with many groups in the parish / community / society / NGOs and at governmental levels. It makes it possible to share experiences between Gabrielite Institutions and to create strong bonds. Through this networking we are enriched with the spirituality of others either locally or internationally.

You are responsible for the proper maintenance of accounts of the school, school records, service books of teachers, and such other registers, returns and statistics as may be specified by the Society/Board.

Handle official correspondence relating to the school and furnish, within the specified dates, the returns and information required by the State Government/ Board. Conduct physical verification of school property and stock thrice a year and ensure the maintenance of stock registers neatly and accurately.
