## My personal reflection on three days of workshop held in Montfort Bhavan Hyderabad

### What did you learn from the three days of workshop?

# SEMINAR FOR JUNIOR BROTHERS



## What did you learn from the three days of Workshop?

During the three-day workshop, I learned many valuable things.

From Bro. Jaico Gervasis' session, I understood that the purpose of life is to be happy. I learned what can truly bring me lasting happiness. I also realized that sometimes our actions and words do not match. At times, I may need to let go of certain things or people for greater happiness. Happiness is found in the present moment, and it depends on the choices I make. I also learned about leadership and how to be a prophet in today's world. I strongly believe that I am called to be a Montfortian, to transform the world through my words and actions.



From Ms. Synu Matthew's session, I learned about how our personality shapes us. In today's world, many children are forced to follow the dreams of others, but that does not lead to true happiness. Instead, it affects their freedom and mental growth. I also learned about the RIASEC model, which shows that each of us has unique talents. These talents can

be used to make a difference in the world. But sometimes, I forget or ignore the gifts God has given me. Another important lesson was about sacred time management. As a child of God, I should be thankful for the life He has given me and for the blessings He continues to give. I also realized that we often make quick decisions that hurt ourselves and others. Instead, I should ask myself: "What would Jesus do" in this situation?

From the session of Bro. Anthony Reddy, I learned that belief is powerful. Even when outside forces try to pull me down, my belief can lift me up. Positive belief brings positive results, and negative belief brings negative outcomes.

From the session of Bro. Shine Alex., I have come to realize that love is a sacred commitment to selfless giving and compassionate presence. Spiritual and religious awakenings have drawn me into deeper communion with God and a life anchored in faith. Psychological awakening enlightened my inner world, fostering emotional maturity and the integration of mind and spirit.

## **MONTFORT CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE MONTFORT NILAYAM, HYDERABAD**



The Academic year 2024–25 was eventful and filled with God's blessings. The centre started with four children with disabilities, and by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025, there were 43 children registered. By 24<sup>th</sup> June 2025, the number had grown to 50 and more are arriving for various services.

A Thanksgiving group therapy was held on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025 to thank God and evaluate the activities of the centre. Many parents shared about the services and success stories of children with disabilities. The staff from the Helen Keller Institute did an excellent job throughout the year in contributing to the development of the children.



During the holidays, every child and parent received a home management follow-up program. It became another success story of the centre, as many parents collaborated well with the program.

Montfort Child Development Centre (MCDC) reopened on 16<sup>th</sup> June 2025 with six new staff members. God has blessed us with two qualified speech therapists, two physiotherapists, and two special educators for children with disabilities. This year, however, the Helen Keller Institute will not be collaborating with the centre.







It was a challenge to find new staff for the centre. By God's grace, we currently have sufficient staff. However, due to the increasing number of children seeking admission, we still need more staff, and this remains an ongoing challenge.



The opening welcome ceremony was well attended by 35 children and their parents, and the centre is now fully active and blooming—with children, parents, a variety of activities, equipment, and furniture.



On 21<sup>st</sup> June, we celebrated International Yoga Day with all the children and their parents. It was a memorable day for everyone

The New Montfort Nilayam community consists of Bro.N.F. Joseph, our experienced veteran missionary and devoted religious. His presence and prayers are a great blessing for the MCDC. We wholeheartedly welcome Brother and wish him an effective and happy stay for the mission at MCDC. We are also happy and proud to have Bro. James Pasala to remain in our community. He has made a unique and prophetic choice to pursue a B.Ed. in Special Education for Intellectually Developmental Disabilities in order to serve the most vulnerable in society as a Montfortian prophet.

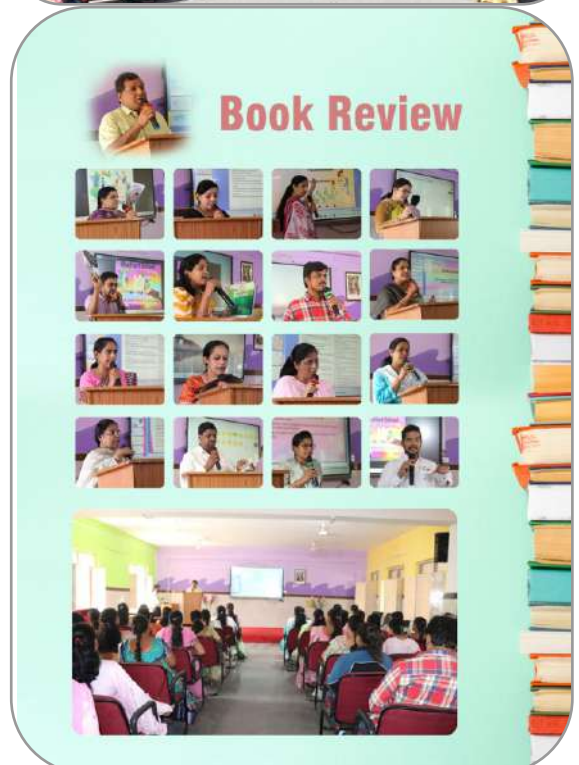
## Honouring Heritage – Telangana Formation Day Celebration:

# MONTFORT ENVIRONMENTAL HUB, NUZVID



Montfort Environmental Hub, a Bio-diversity Centre for Ecological Education and Sustainable Living at Nuzvid, Eluru Dt. in Andhra Pradesh was established in the year 2018 as a state-of-art Biodiversity Centre dedicated to to nurture our capacity to care for the earth, 'our common home' and its community of life through ecological education, fostering ecological awareness, promoting biodiversity conservation, and educating citizens on sustainable living practices. This centre will serve as a vital hub for experiential learning, research, community engagement, and policy advocacy. Equipped with interactive exhibits, green infrastructure, and diverse educational programs, the Montfort Environmental Hub will empower citizens of all ages to connect with nature, understand their ecological footprint, and actively contribute to a greener, more sustainable world.

This centre aligns with India's commitments to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), the National Biodiversity Targets, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), SDG 13 (Climate Action), and SDG 15 (Life on Land). It also supports the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' Swachha Anhdra, and 'Haritha Haram' initiatives of the Andhra Pradesh and Telangana governments, and the call of Pope Francis in Laudato si, to listen to the cry of the earth and cry of the poor

## Sustainable living practices:

Montfort Environmental Hub is built on the core principles of Sustainable Living: eco-friendly constructions, bio-diversity, use of alternate energy, soil and water conservation, proper waste management and organic farming. All the infrastructure will be built using eco-friendly and energy efficient, sustainable and locally available materials

## Bio-Reserve and Nursery:

The campus is a bio-reserve with 28 varieties of fruit trees and 35 varieties of ornamental and shady trees. We have Created outdoor interpretive trails, themed gardens (e.g., medicinal plants, native species, fruit garden). There is a 'Greenhouse' for nursery of local and medicinal plants and vegetable saplings

## Soil Conservation and Organic Farming:

In keeping with the principle of sustainable living and as a centre for training in organic farming, vegetables and fruit are grown by natural and organic methods of farming. Soil fertility is maintained by mixed cropping, green, organic and farm manure, mulching and using biocides and bio fertilizers. We have a functioning Vermicomposting unit producing organic manure.

## Rainwater Harvesting:

Rainwater harvesting pits are made to replenish the ground water reserve and recharge bore wells. A working model of Rain Water Harvesting unit made as a model for learning for children. Vegetables and trees grown by using drip irrigation and mulching to conserve water



## Green Energy and Waste Management Training:

To create a green campus and go carbon neutral, solar power unit (Grid Connected) is installed to meet the energy needs of the campus. Similarly a biogas plant and a working model of windmill will have to be made, for children to learn about alternate energy models. The waste at the centre is segregated at source and bio waste is composted into manure



## Ecological Educational programs:

The centre organizes science fairs, exhibitions seminars and workshops on sustainable gardening, waste reduction, eco-friendly consumption, and energy conservation. Weekend workshops will be organised for families and individuals on topics like home composting, urban gardening and sustainable consumption, we plan to have curriculum-aligned hands-on sessions on topics like water conservation, waste to wealth and composting.



## Environment and Seasonal Festivals:

We celebrate important environment and culture related days e.g., Earth Day, World Environment Day, ethnic and localization day and organic food festivals.



## Eco-spirituality:

The green environs also is a space for students specially from the urban schools and nature lovers to spend time in the serene green environs and appreciate the wealth of God's creation and experience the Divine in it and learn to live in harmony with whole of creation.



## Training in Organic Farming:

'Healthy soil - healthy food – healthy body'. To protect the health of consumers and farmers and produce their own food organically, training and awareness programs in natural and organic farming will be organized in collaboration with the staff of Andhra Pradesh Community Based Natural Farming (APCNF).







### **Skill Training:**

The centre envisages creating infrastructure and giving livelihood skills to families from weaker economic backgrounds to make a living by providing training in Bee-keeping, making organic soaps, and detergents, making low cost, user friendly solar electric appliances, traditional house hold craft materials, and to produce and promote recycled paper and bio degradable bags.



### **Small Scale Industry for Organic Food and Wellness Products:**

With financial support of donors, we plan to build infrastructure and buy equipment and tools to produce organic millet based and other food items and wellness products and empower women through employment.



### **Community engagement and Farm Stay:**

The centre envisages organizing guided tours, and nature camps for schools, colleges, and the public to have hands on experience in organic farming and to enhance ecological awareness and appreciation for

local biodiversity. Volunteer Programs will be promoted to give opportunities for citizens to contribute to garden maintenance, guided tours, and research and data collection (e.g., trees/bird/butterfly counts, water quality monitoring) and organise Outreach Programs to take the centre's message to local communities and associations. With support of donors, plans are to build accommodation for farm stay and work for nature lovers, volunteers and Professionals to have a green living experience, to detox and give back to nature. Facilities will be created for families to visit, relax, and have fun in the lap of nature with guided explorations of the centre's outdoor spaces.
