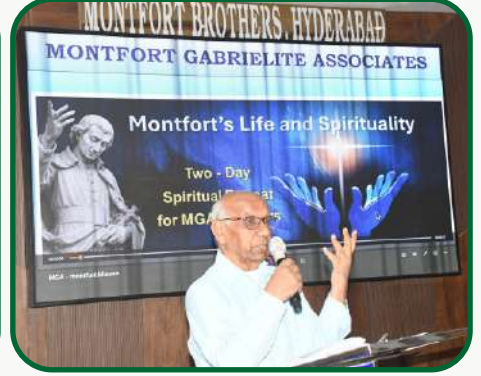

Some of the programs at MCDC during the last 3 months are the following:

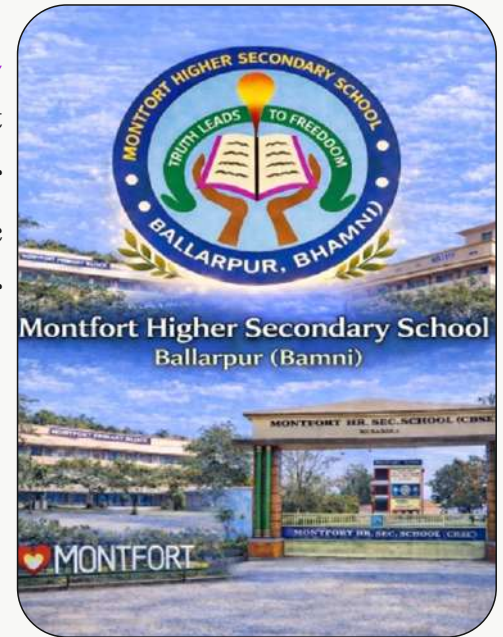


MONTFORT HR. SEC. SCHOOL, BALLARSHAH

Introduction:

Montfort Group of study centers is a unique path breaking initiative of Bro. Monson, the Director of Vanamitra with full support of Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel, Hyderabad Province, as its continued commitment for the service of the poor at the periphery. Through this new initiative we hope to be trendsetters in reaching to the most backward and neglected population with quality education working in unison with local community, local Govt. teachers, Govt. officers and all stake holders. We hope to be an effective agent of transformation in the lives of many people.



Vision:

Enriching and empowering the lives of the most backward children through education.

Mission:

Reaching the most vulnerable tribal children at the periphery of the society.

Objectives:

- To improve the learning standard of students in their own environment.
- To establish healthy rapport with local community, Government teachers and Government officers.
- To inculcate Montfortian values
- To facilitate to improve the standard of Government schools.
- To further build up the social capital with the tribals.
- To create employment to educated unemployed youth and transform them in to proactive and committed leaders through our intervention and support.
- To be a catalyst in solving local community issues.

Modus Operandi:

To establish 45 study centers in 45 different tribal villages using the infrastructure and resources of Government/village. These centers will function 2 hours after the regular school hours. Teachers will be appointed from our side. They will be regularly motivated, trained and monitored by us.

Centres, Staff & Children Details:

The candidates were taken on a one-day outing for a refreshing picnic to the Botanical Garden, where they gained valuable learning experiences while enjoying nature.

Advantages:

1. Educating the kids in their own environment.
2. Can establish good bonding with local community.
3. Will get the good will of Government teachers and officers.
4. Will improve the quality of government schools.
5. These centers could be the feeder schools for our Montfort School.
6. We are creating employment for some educated youth.
7. We are able to reach out to a greater number of under privileged students.
8. Optimum use of Government infrastructure and resources available at the local level.
9. Goals are achieved without the nitty gritty and problems of a regular established school.
10. We become effective agents of Transformation at the grass root level.

Impact of this mission:

The concept was conceived and began in the year 2023 with 25 Centres taking care of 430 tribal students in 25 villages. In the year 2024 too, we continued with the same. In 2025 we increased to 45 study centers in 45 villages taking care of 674 students. In that we have 343 boys and 331 girls. We also have 10 Coordinators. Though the real impact of this mission will be visible only after few years when these students excel in life, some of the changes seen at present are;

- The drop out of students from our centers is nil when they go to other residential schools.
- Our students are better than other students of their class in residential school. Due to which they are appreciated by teachers and some of them are selected as leaders.
- In one center we see a reverse trend of children coming back to Government school from Private English Medium due to our play way method of teaching.
- Local Mandal Education officer publicly appreciated our centers in the cluster meeting of Government teachers.
- Very good rapport is built between local government school teachers and our teachers as well as with parent community.
- On the whole we are able to improve the teaching learning standard of teachers and students.

Conclusion:

In a short span of time, we are able to see that most of the objectives of starting this mission is achieved. As we continue this noble task, I am sure we will make a lasting difference in the lives of many children.

“Contextualized Social Exposure Programme”

My exposure experience at Manapuram, including my interaction with the tribal people and the Savara community, was meaningful and formative. The experience helped me understand their simple lifestyle, livelihood, and strong sense of sharing and mutual support. Despite material limitations, they showed deep human values such as openness, generosity, gratitude, and respect.

I also learned to prepare some basic Ayurvedic medicines using locally available natural resources, which helped me appreciate traditional knowledge and indigenous healing practices. This exposure strengthened my understanding of human dignity and solidarity among the poor. Through the Vana Mitra experience, I learned the importance of caring for nature and living in harmony with the environment. Actively participating in Vana Mitra activities gave me practical insight into environmental responsibility and sustainable practices. Community life at Gopalapuram was marked by fraternity, cooperation, and shared responsibilities. The community brothers were very open, welcoming, and supportive, creating an atmosphere of trust and mutual respect.

Participation with the cultural team encouraged teamwork, creative expression, and awareness building among the people through their programs. Visits to tailoring centers and community outings provided insight into skill-development initiatives and strengthened social bonding. Additionally, the session by Sr. Blanche on holistic healing emphasized that true care goes beyond treatment; it involves loving presence, compassion, listening, and closeness to people at the peripheries. The experience concluded with a refreshing picnic to Thota Palli Dam, Jhanjavathi Dam, and Seethampeta Park, offering moments of relaxation, fellowship, and reflection. Overall, the programme deepened my understanding of mission, community life, and service rooted in lived realities

Living with the villagers was not just a visit; it was a lesson in life that will remain with me forever.
